The Heritage

lans for Landis Homes' new special care center, The Heritage, gradually took shape over the course of the year. The Board of Directors and Management Team in conjunction with our architects and general contractor reviewed and revised the design several times. By year end a final plan was developed and submitted for necessary approvals. At the same time, we found ourselves hoping that a township-wide moratorium on new sewer connections would be lifted allowing us to schedule a groundbreaking date.

Simultaneously Landis Homes embarked on its first capital fund drive to help raise money to build The Heritage and establish an endowment fund. For The Heritage, the Board of Directors established a groundbreaking goal of \$700,000 and a challenge goal of \$1,000,000. Many volunteers were recruited to help present the need for the fund drive to the different Landis Homes constituencies. Special meetings were scheduled with residents and business people to present plans for The Heritage.

We achieved the groundbreaking goal by February of 1997 and hosted a celebration event to mark the accomplishment. In June, we reached and exceeded the challenge goal of one million dollars.

Two events which highlighted the year-long fund drive were the Fun Raising Days sponsored by the Activities Department and the cross country bike trip taken by Ed and Rhoda Longenecker. The Fun Raising Days

included many activities for residents and their families. A Walk/Bike-athon and a benefit auction highlighted the week. The proceeds from these events went to help Ed and Rhoda reach their Bike Trip goal. In June when the Longeneckers set out for their trip we had received over \$100,000 in cash and pledges which did take the fund drive over the top of the challenge goal.







chair bus. The following June, the Auxiliary invited all residents to the Strawberry Social.


Another successful volunteer program is Spring Housecleaning. This year 84 volunteers from 29 congregations contributed time to help do "spring cleaning" in the health care rooms.
